

Meriden Archery Club Spring Bank Holiday WA 720 & H2H's Monday 27th May 2024

Format:

- Morning: World Record Status WA 720 Ranking round at 70m recurve, 60m recurve and 50m compound/barebow. Compound targets will have one 6-ring face per archer, whilst all other targets will have one 10-ring target face per target.
- Afternoon: Head to Head matches in each division

Timings:

- Strictly no access or entry before 07:30 am
- o Registration from 08:00 08:30 am proof of AGB membership will be required
- Equipment inspection: from 08:00 am in front of the Judges hut
- Assembly: 08:30 am followed by 45 minutes of official practice

Awards:

- Small trophies will be awarded to first, second and third place only. Trophies will be given for any of the divisions which have enough competitors, otherwise only fist place will be awarded at most.
- Note: the 60m recurve and 50m compound will have all archers from U18 U12 competing together.

 Target list will be available 48hours beforehand, and results will be displayed 24 hours after the event on lanseo

ArcheryGB Compliance:

- Tents: are permitted and can be put up between 5-7 pm (only) on the day before the competition. Do not pitch over the # area. Overnight camping or practice is not permitted at this time.
- Food and Drink: Hot and cold along with a selection of cold food (cakes, pastries, etc.) will be available in the Clubhouse from 08:00am Please bring your own cup to reduce the waste. Hot food will not be provided.
- o **Toilets:** Male, female and disabled toilets are provided.
- O Dogs: are permitted but must be kept on a lead at all times
- Smoking: inc. vapes is only permitted behind the last row of tents
- Drug testing: World Record Status shoots are liable for drug testing and any competitors approached to give samples must comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Where an entry form contains junior entries, the parent or guardian must countersign the form to confirm they consent to their child being tested if approached.
- Data Protection/GDPR: By entering the event, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, ArcheryGB and other competitors. Some information may also be published in documents or lists relating to the event to a schedule decided by the organisers. These include the entrant's name, gender, bow style, age category, round disability information, email addresses and/or contact numbers provided, club, county, region and any assigned codes for this information.
